

## VAT Exemptions Explained

We offer VAT exemptions on certain products. In order to qualify for VAT relief the following must BOTH be true:

- Is the **product** eligible for VAT exemption?
- Is the end user eligible for VAT exemption?
- Is the product eligible for VAT exemption?

A product's eligibility for VAT exemption is not dictated by us, it is decided by the manufacturer in tandem with HM Revenue & Customs.

• Is the end user eligible for VAT exemption?

To be eligible for VAT exemption, the government says the end user must be 'chronically sick or disabled', defined if he/she is a person:
1) with a physical or mental impairment which has a long-term and substantial adverse effect upon his/her ability to carry out activities; or
2) with a condition which the medical profession treats as a chronic sickness, such as diabetes; or
3) who is terminally ill.

• **Please note:** This definition does not include a frail elderly person who is otherwise ablebodied, or any person who is only temporarily disabled or incapacitated, such as with a broken limb.

## Please note:

- It is an offence to claim VAT exemption if you are not entitled to it, and the penalties for false claims are severe
- Upon request from HM Revenue & Customs we will disclose all details of claimed exemptions
